Beacon Sloop Club General Meeting Minutes, March 5, 2013

Meeting began at 7:35 with Barry Finch leading the large crowd in singing "Last Night I Had the Strangest Dream." President David Eberle welcomed new guests from Pennsylvania, New Jersey, New York City, Woodstock, and Beacon.

David gave the treasurer's report in Sarah Elisabeth's absence. The closing balance is \$86,912. (See full report elsewhere in newsletter)

Tom LaBarr gave the Woody report. The cover will be taken off the Woody on April 6th. Work parties will be on Saturdays and Sundays from 9:00 a.m. to noon. The Woody Dinner made \$2000 for the club. The sail class begins April 10th and runs for eight weeks. Tom also explained the process of crew promotions from crew to mate to captain-in-training to captain.

Saul Rozinsky gave the Building Committee Report. Saul reminded the club that all work is volunteer. The wall framing and electric are almost done but the finishing work will be done by volunteers. David Eberle reported that the multrum is now in full working order.

Joyce Hanson announced that on April 20th will be a solar demonstration taught by Saul Rozinsky. It is free but limited to twenty people. Saul explained that the event will be to show people how to use solar panels for practical uses.

Alan Thomas announced that on April 13th at 1 p.m. there is a film screening of "Chasing Ice" at the Beacon Theater. The Academy Award-nominated film's director will be present and the film will be followed by a panel discussion. See flyer elsewhere in newsletter.

Alan Thomas also noted that on April 19th will be the April lecture in the Sloop Club's winter/spring lecture series. The event is on the American Revolution in the Hudson Valley and will be a child-friendly evening.

Joyce Hanson announced that there will be a concert at the Sloop Club on April 27th to raise money for the club. Jacob and David Bernz, Motherload Trio, and Open Book will be playing. There is also a multimedia celebration with the Earthtones at 7:00 p.m.

David Eberle announced that on May 11th the Sloop Club is joining Scenic Hudson's River Sweep and art contest.

He also explained the fundraising aspects of Clearwater Board membership. Allan announced that if the club is interested in nominating anyone for the board by petition, the petition requires the signatures of thirty Clearwater members by mid-July.
