<u>Treasurer's Report</u> by Aaron Verdile for the month of June. Total income was \$13,822. Net income was -\$14300 [check with Aaron on these amounts]. Made more than \$9k from the Strawberry festival.

Corn Festival by Rosemary. Festival is August 13 (12-5). Last year's layout worked out well so we will repeat. Need volunteers to make chilli. Josh will work on the solar trailer. Bonnie is working on baskets. We need people to donate contents. We need folks to move cement blocks from David Eberle's house. New T-shirts will be \$10 for volunteers for a limited supply. Please post the fliers throughout Beacon. Bonnie said we should carry out Pete's favorite festival and this is the only festival that has a raffle. Pick one of Bonnie's baskets and pick a theme for the raffle. Also bring a gift you wish to re-gift and donate. Bonnie also mentioned that the swim is August 12 and let her know if you wish to sponsor her swim.

<u>Woody Report</u> by James Malchow. James asked everyone to thank Alan and Vince who worked almost everyday for two weeks to get the Woody into the water. There also has been fantastic weekend volunteer turnout. The Woody went in the water on Thursday. The boat is still in Kingston. The motor installation is planned. The Harbor committee is going to be building the new charging dock. August 26 is the expected return of the Woody to Beacon. Jim Birmingham made an appeal for volunteers to build the charging docks tomorrow morning. The old batteries will be picked up Monday – after the meeting, please help to put them out on the pallet. There was discussion on where to put the pallet and other logisitics.

<u>Concert</u> report by James Malchow. Jacob and David Bernz will be having a concert at the Town Crier to benefit the Sloop Club on the evening of August 12.




