Jim Birmingham gave a Woody report. The work on the Woody is speeding up now that the shipwrights are back on the job. And bills keep coming in - \$213,000 to date. Volunteers continue to be needed, especially tomorrow to raise the mast up into storage.

Aaron Verdile announced the free Holiday Sing on December 10 at 6PM. He will be setting up starting at 2 or 3. You can bring snacks & desserts for the sing and cash or canned goods for the food pantry.

#### **The Woody Report**

The work on the Woody is progressing nicely with a full crew of shipwrights and a few of our heartier volunteers. The frame work is up to number 17 on port and starboard., about 70% complete. Six floors are made and ready to install, 4 are made and need final shaping. The stem is complete and installed. The mast step is 98% complete, not yet installed. The ballast shoe is bored, countersunk and ready to be installed. The keel splice installed.

The deadwood is installed except for the fairing piece above the propeller aperture-this is made but needs final shaping, work to rebate and installation (70% complete). Final work to rebate (80% complete) on other deadwood needs to be finished.

The transom/horntimber knee patterned and started. (35% complete). The breasthook and knightheads are installed and the sampson post is complete and ready for installation. Two out of three sections of kingplank are complete but not installed.

Deck framing complete except for potentially cutting back the inboard ends of the frames within the cuddy. (+-98% complete)






Due to Sarah's vacation we are omitting this month's treasury report.

This change will give a more accurate view of the Club's financial position at the end of the previous month after reconciliation has been done.
