Opening Music:

Lydia Adams Davis, Ken Miller, Mary Poppins, and Ben Mazer gave a spirited performance of the song "Somos El Barco" (We Are the Boat). Lydia followed the sing-along by sharing the fascinating history of Pete Seeger's inspiration for him performing the classic song.

Opening Announcements:

Patricia gave a warm welcome as our new club president. She thanked Rob May for all his hard work and dedication to the club. She then welcomed all new members.

Treasurer's Report:

Aaron gave a detailed treasury report for the month of November. (See treasury report for full details).

Budget for 2025:

Aaron reviewed the proposed budget. He stated that copies were available to anyone who would like one upon request. An inquiry was made as to the \$1,000.00 budgeted expense of publishing a physical newsletter. Alan explained that we have several long-term members without email and the physical newsletter will continue to be provided to those who require it for now. The expenses in relation to the dock repair were also explained. A motion was made to pass the budget. The motion was passed unanimously.

Woody/Harbor Report:

The Woody remains docked for winter storage in Haverstraw. Work parties will commence in warmer weather come spring. Dock repair will also begin in the spring.

Winter Lecture Series:

EPA Finalizes Review of Upper Hudson PCB Cleanup after Considering Public Comment; Agency Will Issue Report Addendum by 2027

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency has finalized its third periodic review of the cleanup of polychlorinated biphenyls (PCBs) in the Upper Hudson River. The EPA looked at all the project data for water, fish and sediment collected between 2016-2021, and the fish data from 2022. The EPA's review concludes that the levels of PCBs in water and fish are going down overall, but more fish data is needed. The agency states that it needs at least eight years of data after dredging to draw science-based conclusions about the rate of recovery in the fish. The eighth year of fish data was collected in 2024. The results of that sampling will be available in 2025. The EPA did not make a decision about protectiveness. The EPA will release an addendum to the report when enough fish data is available, as soon as this year but no later than 2027.

The Friends of a Clean Hudson coalition maintains, based on its <u>independent analysis</u> of the data trends, that the Upper Hudson River PCB cleanup is not protecting human health and the environment as required. They further conclude that the health risks associated with fish consumption are well above the EPA's accepted risk range and well above New York's advisories, and that agency disregards long-standing environmental justice policies intended to address pollution in disadvantaged communities.

Without a determination protectiveness, the development of additional remediation plans is delayed.

Day One

President Trump announced immediate moves to reverse policies to curb greenhouse gas emissions and climate change, while boosting fossil fuel extraction. Trump signed an executive order pulling the United States out of the Paris Agreement, joining Iran, Syria, and Yemen, as the only nations not participating.

Other orders freeze pending environmental regulations; remove protections that prevent oil drilling in deep oceans; undo a ban on drilling off most of the coastal US; proclaim an "energy emergency,"; facilitate unrestrained fossil fuel extraction—including drilling in the Arctic National Wildlife Refuge, and rescinding Biden's climate and clean energy policies.

According to the White House, "The president will unleash American energy by ending Biden's policies of climate extremism, streamlining permitting, and reviewing for rescission all regulations that impose undue burdens on energy production and use, including mining and processing of non-fuel minerals, President Trump's energy actions empower consumer choice in vehicles, showerheads, toilets, washing machines, lightbulbs and dishwashers."
