

Treasurer's Report by Aaron: Numbers for the end of January

Woman's Work/Woody Dinner on Sunday 4/15: Lydia is doing a wonderful concert at the Howland Cultural Center starting at 3pm. Lydia needs help transporting artist/musicians from the train station, setup, merchandise, and take-down. Lydia is also looking for art and food donation. There is a signup sheet passing around for Woman's Work. At 5pm at the Chalet on the Hudson, we are having our Woody Dinner and everyone is welcome. Judith Tulloch will be providing the music. The Dinner itself is 6pm to 10pm and cost is \$60 – half goes to the Woody. We are looking for items for a raffle or silent auction.

<u>Woody report</u> by Steve S: Still floating at the Haverstraw Marina. It is still sitting quietly there. This week on Sunday, we will have the first Captain's meeting followed by the sailors meeting at 10-11. After the sailors meeting, we will have the block [maintenance] party – dissembling and oiling little wooden blocks. Please bring screwdrivers, sand papers, and rags if you have them. This is usually done in a production line and a potluck. There are ideas for discussion: sailing up to Kingston for the museum event in May, the revival, a festival in Cornwall, sailing on the weekends, fleshing out the season.

By the end of March and if there is no ice, we will bring the boat back. We will take it to Whites Marina to pull it out of the water to check and touch up the boat. At the revival, we still provide free sailing but if you want to volunteer as a Clearwater volunteer, you will need to be a member and pay the volunteer fee and you will get a t-shirt and food.

Sailing Class by Susan: Will be from 4/11 – 5/30 on Wednesdays from 7pm to 9pm here at the clubhouse. We are hoping to have the boat ready for the last day of class.

<u>Lectures</u> by Susan: The next one will be barrel making by John Cox on 3/8. After that on April, we are expecting the Woody rebuild movie with Jim Kricker. After that will be Iona Island.

River Sweep by Susan: Will be Saturday May 5 run by Riverkeeper that we will be part of.

Oceans 8 Films' *Hope on the Hudson, the Restoration of the Clearwater* is part of an ongoing series of documentaries about our Hudson River called "Hudson River Stories" (HudsonRiverStories.com).



Jim Kricker grew up in the Catskill Mountain - Hudson Valley region of New York State where he spent his early years in the shops of his father and grandfather. It was here that he developed a deep appreciation for traditional craft, tools, and historic building. Along a somewhat parallel trajectory came a keen interest in wooden sailing craft. Jim is currently the director of the Riverport Wooden Boat School.

Jim Kricker will discuss the materials and techniques employed in restoring two iconic historic vessels and some of the challenges faced by his team of shipwrights at the Hudson River Maritime Museum's Riverport Wooden Boat School in Kingston NY. Once common in the Hudson Valley, the materials and skills required to build and maintain wooden sailing vessels are now rare.

The evening will feature a screening of Oceans 8 Films' *Hope on the Hudson, the Restoration of the Clearwater*. This film is part of an ongoing series of documentaries about our Hudson River called "Hudson River Stories" (HudsonRiverStories.com). The film has recently been selected to premier at the 21st Annual Sonoma International Film Festival in March.


